The media workshop is open to journalists from the United States, Canada, Mexico, Australia and New Zealand with a background in energy, climate and environmental policy. We aim for a mix of participants representing the entire range of media from major newspapers, broadcasters, news agencies to online media.

In specific cases and upon individual application we can provide funding support for travel of up to 700 Euros per person.

Presentations during the workshop will be either in English or in German. English-German simultaneous interpretation will be provided.
